Transient Rules & Regulations

To promote the safety, welfare and enjoyment of Commodore Yacht Club, the following Transient Rules and Regulations have been established by the Board of Directors of Commodore Yacht Club.

- 1) No towels, carpets or fenders may be hung from the dock structure. Skis and floats may not be stored on the dock fingers.
- 2) No fuel containers of any kind are permitted on A, B, or C docks. All fueling is restricted to the fuel dock. No smoking is allowed on the fuel dock or on a boat which is being fueled.
- 3) Open fires (except as provided below) on the docks or on board boats berthed in a slip, are strictly prohibited. This includes but is not limited to charcoal cooking, hibachis, torches, kerosene heaters or any type of camp type cooking equipment. Transients may cook on their boats using a boat builder installed marine range or cook top certified by the U.S. Coast Guard.
- 4) Unattended portable battery chargers are not permitted.
- 5) All vessels while in the harbor (which includes the channel to the river) shall proceed at a NO WAKE, engine idle speed. This includes personal watercraft, runabouts, fishing boats, and ski boats.
- 6) Running or bike riding on the docks is prohibited.
- 7) Dogs are permitted on the grounds of the club if they are leashed and not a nuisance to others. Dogs which soil the docks or that bark excessively will be banned from the grounds.
- 8) Dogs are not to be walked in the common areas at the head of the docks but in the designated pet area. Owners are responsible to clean up after their pets if they soil the common areas.
- 9) Discharge of oily bilge contents is not permitted in the harbor.
- 10) Discharge of human waste in the harbor is prohibited. Pump out service is provided at the fuel dock.
- 11) Transients are encouraged to treat each other with respect and consideration. Those who are unruly, destructive, vulgar, openly hostile to others or behave in a manner that's unlawful or disruptive to the good order of the club will be subject to fines, suspension and asked to leave.
- 12) Noise on the docks should be kept to a minimum. Excessively loud music from a transient's boat is not permitted.
- 13) Gates to the slips and parking lot are to always remain closed.
- 14) Trash is to be disposed of properly in the dumpster located in the parking lot. Do not leave cans, bottles, or trash of any kind on the docks or on any boat docked in the marina.

Sewage Treatment/No Overboard Discharge Agreement

I, _____, understand that overboard discharge of untreated waste is prohibited. I have read and understand the information below and agree to abide by the rules of the club regarding treatment of sewage and overboard discharge.

If your boat has an installed toilet, by law you must have a Marine Sanitation Device. It is illegal to discharge untreated sewage on inland waters. To legally dispose of sewage boaters must either have an on board treatment device (Type I or Type II MSD) or a holding tank (Type III MSD) to hold the waste and have it pumped out.

General Tips:

- When tied up to a dock, use onshore facilities. Encourage guests to take advantage of the onshore restrooms before you set out for a day trip.
- Regularly maintain your MSD and the attached plumbing and install the best hose you can afford to reduce odors.
- Obey the law keep untreated sewage out of all coastal and inland waters.
- Find out if you are boating in a No Discharge Zone and do not discharge any sewage, treated or not, in a No Discharge Zone.

Approved MSDs:

There are three different types of MSDs that can be certified by the U.S. Coast Guard to meet the requirements in 33 CFR Part 159, each having its own design, certification, and discharge criteria. For more information see 33 CFR 159.53.

- 1) Type I is a flow through discharge device that produces effluent having a fecal coliform bacteria count not greater than 1,000 per 100 milliliters and no visible floating solids. This type of device is typically a physical/chemical based system that relies on maceration and chlorination. Type I MSDs are issued a Certificate of Approval.
- 2) Type II is a flow through discharge device that produces effluent having a fecal coliform bacteria count not greater than 200 per 100 milliliters and suspended solids not greater than 150 milligrams per liter. This type of device is typically a biological or aerobic digestion based system.
- 3) Type III is a device that prevents the overboard discharge of treated or untreated sewage or any waste derived from sewage. This type of device is typically a holding tank and may include other types of technology including incineration, recirculation, and composting. For Type III holding tanks:
 - Use enzyme deodorizers for holding tanks and portable toilets.
 - Pump out before you winterize your boat.
 - Know where your closest pump out stations are located, the seasonal closures and hours of operation. Consider using a pump out boat service if one is offered in your area to make pumping out more convenient.

Commodore Yacht Club Waiver & Release of Liability

1. By signing this Waiver and Release of Liability (Agreement), I waive and release Commodore Yacht Club, its agents, servants, employees, insurers, successors and assigns from any and all claims, demands, causes of action, damages or suits at law and equity of any kind, including but not limited to claims for personal injury, property damage, medical expenses, loss of services, on account of or in any way related to or growing out of my presence or involvement at the facility.

This waiver and release is intended to and does release Commodore Yacht Club from any and all liability for damages or injuries on account of or in any way related to or growing out of my negligence, the negligence of third parties and Commodore Yacht Club's negligence. This is not intended to release Commodore Yacht Club from any liability resulting from their intentional conduct.

I further covenant and agree not to institute any claims or legal action against Commodore Yacht Club for any claim released by this Agreement. I further agree that should any claim be made against Commodore Yacht Club in contravention of this Agreement, including but not limited to derivative claims, I will protect, defend and completely indemnify (reimburse) Commodore Yacht Club for any such claim and expenses including attorney's fees and costs incurred by Commodore Yacht Club in defending themselves or security indemnity hereunder.

2. I understand that Commodore Yacht Club is not responsible for any lost, stolen, or damaged valuables or property.

3. I acknowledge that I have received and read a copy of the current rules and regulations governing the use of the facility. I agree that I will fully comply with all rules and regulations and with any amendments. I have read the Agreement and understand that by signing the Agreement I have consented to be bound by its terms, including the waiver/release of any legal right I may have to sue Commodore Yacht Club for any costs they incur because a claim or legal action is brought in violation of this Agreement. I agree any violation of the Agreement and its terms and conditions, as determined by Commodore Yacht Club, will void and terminate this Agreement and may result in loss of the ability to use the facility.

I have read and understand the terms of this 5 page agreement and am signing freely, voluntarily, and competently and am at least eighteen (18) years of age.
